## R E M A R K S

### Bayou Corne Inspection

**John Boudreaux with Assumption Parish, Vince Cheramine with DEQ, and myself left command post and went to**

area where Acadian gas pipeline was bleeding down there 20" line down to 48# held for approx. 3 hrs. Left site went on water to area of pipelines bubbles. No change in the bubbles. Did the gas testing with the portable MSA meter at the 7 sites of bubbles.

Site 1-- was a Crosstex pipeline crossing @ GPS reading: North 30-00'24.6" West 91-08'45.7"

Site 2--was a Acadian Gas pipeline crossing @ GPS reading North 30-00'24.3" West 91-08'44.7"

Site 3-- marked by 3/4" PVC pipe @ GPS reading North 30-00'08.7" West 91-08'42.1"

Site 4 -was in canal next to 3/4" PVC pipe @ GPS reading North 30-00'11.1" West 91-08'11.3"

Site 5-was marked by 3/4" PVC pipe @ GPS reading North 30-00'13.2" West 91-08'09.7"

Site 6--was marked by 3/4" PVC pipe @ GPS reading North 30-00'24.9" West 91-08'07.5"

Site 7-- was marked by a 3/4"PVC pipe @GPS reading North 30-00'30.1" West 91-08'05.9"

At each site DEQ agent Vince used a portable MSA meter to check for gas. None was detected.

The 3 portable gas meters are still in area to monitor S02 and LEL gas. The 4 Seismic meter are still in area to survey ground trimmers

John Boudreaux, with Assumption Parish, Vince Cheramine with DEQ, and myself, made the afternoon site visits at each site, Vince used the MSA portable meter to scan for gasses. No gas was measured at any of the seven sites.

I took GPS reading on the North West side of the first bubble next to the Crosstex crossing.

Reading ----North 30-00'24.7" West 91-09'46.8"

Took GPS reading on the South East end of the bubble after the last Acadian Crossing

Reading North 30-00'24.2" West 91-08' 44.7"

In between these reading are several spots that have bubbles.

DEQ agents are going to homes in the area to check grounds for any gases. Homes tested at this time so far, no gas was detected.

Acadian gas was given the word to pressure there sales line back up around noon time. On the after noon run no change was detected with the bubbles around the sales line.

The GPS reading of the Acadian Pipeline blow down was

North 30-01' 10.4" West 91-08'15.5"

The Acadian personal at site was Bryan Giroir.
